
To be instrumental in transforming the lives of underprivileged and vulnerable children and families living in poverty.

Viva Foundation of South Africa Timeline

2007

Founded by Leon & Meleney Kriel to uplift vulnerable children and families.

2008

Established first community service hubs offering education and support.

2012

Launched Viva Township Art Programme and SAPRI GBV Prevention Programmes 2014

Built strategic partnerships to expand infrastructure and programs. Launched Viva Independent Schools.

2020

COVID-19 emergency response with food aid and remote learning support.

2023

Recognised as a leading community-based organisation driving sustainable impact in high-risk areas.

How We Are Funded?

Individual Donations


- One-Time Gifts: Support specific campaigns, events, or urgent needs (e.g. families caring for Orphand and Vulnerable Children, food parcels).
- **Recurring Donations:** Monthly supporters sustain daily operations like school meals, child sponsorships, and music & art workshops.
- Global Supporters: Donors from South Africa, Germany, and beyond contribute to both short- and long-term impact.

Corporate Partnerships

- CSR-Funded Projects: Support from brands like Mazda, KFC Add Hope, and others fund CAPEX and specific programs (e.g. education, infrastructure etc.).
- Employee Giving & Volunteering: Companies involve staff in fundraising and volunteering at Viva sites.
- Shared Value Collaborations: We co-develop projects that create social impact and brand alignment — e.g. social enterprise investments, research & resource development.

Income-Generating Projects

- **Social Enterprises:** Food Forest, event hosting, water bottling, and hospitality [guest cottages create revenue to reinvest in programs].
- Facility Rentals: Facilities and training spaces rented to corporates or NGOs provide sustainable income.



At Viva, we believe in **creating opportunity through sustainability**. Our social enterprise initiatives — like the Food Forest and upcoming water bottling facility are important fund-development tools and simultaneously empower communities with practical skills, meaningful work and income.



The Fruit Food Forest

- Fruit trees and vegetables planted to provide fresh fruit for school children
- Planned Hydroponics and vegetable cultivation project
- Surplus fruit and vegetables sold to generate income for Viva
- Combining food security, environmental education & sustainable funding



Water Bottling Facility (In Development)

- Solar-powered borehole system to extract and bottle clean water
- Providing water to local community with collapsed water infrastructure
- Income-generating project to support operational costs
- Empowers local staff through training and employment



Hospitality & Income Generation through Events & Asset Optimisation

- On-site accommodation rented to guests incl. consultants and contractors working in Cullinan's mining sector
- Provides consistent revenue to support local Viva programs
- Also used to host volunteer groups and training participants
- Accommodation for choir camps & event guests

At Viva, we believe **no child should go hungry**. Poor nutrition hampers development and learning ability. Through the school feeding scheme, poverty alleviation and emergency assistance, we ensure nutritional security to vulnerable children, families and the elderly. Sustainability initiatives like the Food Forest, ensure the longevity of this programme.





Daily School Meals

- Every child at Viva School Campuses receives two cooked meals each school day
- Meals improve focus, well-being, and classroom engagement
- Supported by partnerships international and local individual donors as well as corporate donors such as KFC Add Hope, the School Feeding Scheme enables consistent food supply & nutritional security.

Food Parcel Drives - Regular support & Emergency Initiatives

- Regular distribution of food hampers to families in need incl. the elderly, child- and granny-headed households
- Holiday and emergency food support during critical times
- Mobilised through volunteer and donor support
- Material support includes blankets in winter, donated clothing and household items
- During COVID19 Lockdown, all Viva resources were channeled into providing food security and more than 2 million individual meals were distributed via 19 distribution points in Gauteng



At Viva, we believe that **growth starts with purpose**. By investing in youth and volunteers, we unlock confidence, build skills, and nurture leaders who can drive change in their own communities. Whether through mentorship, service, or hands-on training, we empower individuals to rise, lead, and give back.
